In Brighton there are three army surplus suppliers: *Paul Brutton* on New England Road, *The Military Man* at the bottom of Elm Grove and *The Market Place* 7-8 Meeting Place Lane which also has some fancy dress. There is also an Army Surplus store in Hailsham.

We also hold several jumble sales a year at Ringmer Village Hall. Jumbles have plenty of items that those handy with a needle can adapt. You can also come and help with our jumbles if you have some spare time.

Lewes Little Theatre and the Barcombe shop 'The Sublime to the Ridiculous' periodically hold sales of costumes. Being Brighton there is also a whole array of fancy dress shops that can cater for all types of costumes and tastes.
