Trevor Gearing: A Tribute

Trevor Gearing, who passed away earlier in the Summer, was a long time supporter of Nevill Juvenile Bonfire Society. NJBS President Phil Amey has written the following tribute.

I first met Trevor when I was 14, however, I suspect that Trevor knew me from the day I was born. I think the phrase "I know your Mum and Dad" was quite prevalent back then. I met with Trevor to get his help with the forming of the Nevill Juvenile Bonfire Society.

I'm a founder member and its current President. Julia and Trevor would invite us to have dinner, in relays, while preparing for our night. During Dinner Trevor would tell us about Bonfires Past and his families involvement.

Trevor was a wealth of knowledge, on many subjects, as I've found out through the years. I've spent many hours with Trevor learning the History of Lewes Bonfire and how integral his family has been to the celebrations.

He told me how his Father and Uncles went off to the First World War in the ranks of the Royal Sussex Regiment. It was soon learned that this group of men had a secret; They, between them, could make the Lewes Rouser. I am led to believe that they spent some of their time in the war crawling through No Man's Land and dropping their homemade devices into the Front-Line Trenches of the Enemy.

As long as there is Lewes Bonfire, Trevor's name will be remembered. Like all the lifelong bonfire boys their spirit

will continue to fire the flames of tradition.

From my very first meeting with Trevor, some 50 years ago, we have remained firm

friends. He was there for my Wedding to Jane Amey and offered to drive us in his Morris 1800 (see photo), causing congestion on School Hill, outside the registry office.



He would always send cards to our Daughter, Cassandra, often addressed to "Ruth", Cassandra Aitchison's middle name and was my Mother's name, always saying to me - I hope you don't mind.

I moved away from Lewes with my job but, whenever I returned I would do my best to find the time to call in to see Trevor, Julia and Margaret. Trevor was my Mentor and my friend.

There is a quote by Terry Pratchett

"It has been said that a man is not dead while his name is still spoken. That we are only truly gone when we disappear from the memories of those who loved us"

Well, Trevor is alive in my Memory and that of my Family and we loved him.



Farewell to Fletching Bonfire Society: 1854-2017
