Extravaganza is nearly here!

We are now only days away from the Nevill Extravaganza. This is a time for Society members and residents to come together and enjoy a day out on the Green on what we anticipate will be a fantastic event.

Not only is it a great way for us to celebrate as a community, it is also important for the Society to fundraise and support the local community.

We will be celebrating the Queen's official 90th birthday on Saturday 11th June 2016 with another Extravaganza on Nevill Green. As in past years we are looking to hold the event in two parts:

Fayre between 12.00 to 16.30 with displays, games, stalls, food and drink. There will again be entertainment throughout the afternoon including Dance Academy display, a ladies and men's Tug of War competition between the bonfire societies for the bonfire cup; a Torch making competition and the very best of the Starfish Youth Music

There will be a Harvey's bar, refreshments, Pimms tent, as well as catering from The Seasoned Sausage Company and The Hearth Pizzeria and Bakehouse. The Society is providing tea for all residents of Nevill estate who have reached their 90th birthday with the support of Waitrose Stores and the Mayor of Lewes who is coming along to cut the cake and present the Tug of War cups.

The second part of the event consists of **evening entertainment between 18.00 to 22.00** with live music from the Fat Belly Jones Band, a popular nine piece band covering songs from 70's to today. They will be supported by senior

Starfish bands. The evening will be concluded with a small firework display paying tribute to the Queen and another Olympic year. This part of the event is ticketed with tickets priced at £4 in advance and £5 on the day. Advance Family tickets will be available at £15 (2 adults & up to 3 children). These will be available at Lewes Local newsagents on Nevill Estate, Union Music and 7 East Street and are strictly limited to 500 tickets.

Please support the event and encourage your friends, work colleagues and relatives to come along, purchase tickets early to avoid disappointment.

You can still donate your time by offering to help on the day to erect/dismantle marquees, run a game or stall for an hour or longer. We need people to make some cakes for the refreshment stall so all you Mary Berry's (berries?!) out there please get your ovens on. Even donating an hour of your time will help the event run more smoothly and help ensure future events are planned.
